

Reza Alijani receives the 10th RSF - Fondation de France Prize as the repression goes on in Iran

At the same time as Reporters sans frontlères (RSF - Reporters Without Borders) and the Fondation de France awarded its 10th Prize last Wednesday, in the Assemblée Nationale, to Iranian journalist Reza Alijani, the Iranian authorities are continuing their censorship of the media. The newspaper Mellat was suspended on 29 November. The reason given by the authorities is to prevent " offensive measures aimed at creating tension and insecurity in the climate of the country's press ". Distribution was previously suspended on 23 May 2001, the day after the first issue was published.



The unjustified arrests of journalists goes on. **Siamak Pourzand**, 70 years old, a diabetic with a weak heart, has been missing since 24 November. He collaborated in recent weeks with radio stations of the Iranian opposition based in the United States. According to Amnesty International, the disappearance of the journalist is connected with the fact that he is the manager of the Majmue-ye Farrhangi-ye Honari-ye Tehran, the cultural center of Tehran where he receives artists, intellectuals and writers. The journalist was particulary famous for his articles against the Islamic regime. Siamak Pourzand is the husband of human rights lawer Mehrangiz Kar, who is now living in the United States. **Issa Khandan**, head of the social service of two dailies, *Khordad* and *Fath*, was arrested on 10 November by the clergy court. His wife stated that she does not know the reason of his arrest.
