## Tehran offers peace to Kurds

The Iranian Government has announced that an agreemen has been reached with the rebels in the troubled Western province of Kurdestan. But no independent communication was available last night from Kurdish headquarters.

Such an agreement woul bring to an end some of th most bitter fighting since Aya tollah Khomeini swept t power last February. Abou 500 people are believed t have died in the last tw

According to the State radio an agreement was reached during talks yesterday between senior Government officials and a Kurdish negotiating team that much allow the Iranian Army to enter the Kurdish

Apart from two small incident yesterday, no serious hostilities have been reported for three days while both sides awaited the outcome of the negotiations. Mahabad itself was surrounded last night by armoured columns of the Troman military, with units from the 6th Division reported to be only three miles
